What is a 'conservation station'?

Whether or not you've previously worked with a conservator, or know of conservation work at a local site, there are ways to be involved. Here are some ideas, but we're also open to your suggestions.

- Pop-up Shop Set up a temporary conservation studio in a heritage space
- **Conservation in Action** Undertake a conservation project on an item in your collection, a piece of furniture or a decorative feature during the festival
- Show & Tell Invite a conservator who worked on your collection / site to give a talk about what they did
- **Expert Talk** Host a talk led by a conservator, e.g.: "how to care for your personal treasures"/ "looking after the family silver"

How to get involved
