- ▶ Lunch

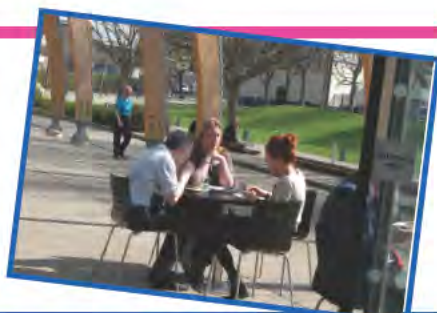
