

## Heritage Open Days Photography Competition – T&Cs

Please ensure you read the competition rules as set out in the following terms and conditions. Entry into the competition will be taken to mean you agree to these rules.

1. This competition is open to all residents of the UK, except for employees of the National Trust, their families or anyone else associated with this competition.
2. All information detailing how to enter this competition forms part of these terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that all terms and conditions are adhered to. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. The judges' decisions (whether in relation to determining any shortlists, runners up, or winners) are final. No correspondence will be entered into regarding such decisions.
4. Entries should be submitted either via email to [info@heritageopendays.org.uk](mailto:info@heritageopendays.org.uk). Image files (from both digital cameras and smartphones) where possible, should be a minimum of 300dpi and 2000 pixels in length as a jpeg file of maximum 10Mb. Any number of images may be submitted. Entrants must supply their name, email address, where the image was taken and a brief description of how the images relates to the theme of 'POWER', as well as any model release forms required. We regret that we are unable to accept postal entries.
5. All entries must be received by 23:59 on 1 October 2019. Late, incomplete or corrupt entries will not be accepted.
6. Entrants under the age of 16 must obtain the consent of a parent or guardian prior to submitting any images.
7. All images submitted must be the work of the individual submitting them and must not have been published elsewhere (excluding social media) or have won a prize in any other photographic competition.
8. All images entered must celebrate your experiences at Heritage Open Days events taking place in 2019
9. The pictures must be taken at a Heritage Open Days event
10. It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that any images they submit have been taken with the consent (or consent of a parent/guardian if the subject is under the age of 18) for anyone who is identifiable. An official model release form must accompany any images in this instance.
11. Entrants must ensure that the photographs they are submitting are their own work, that they own the copyright for them and that they do not infringe the copyright or other rights of any third party or any laws.
12. Entrants will retain copyright and moral rights in their submitted images however, by entering, all entrants:

(a) grant the National Trust acting as the coordinator for Heritage Open Days non-exclusive rights to use the images on within their official impact report and on the Heritage Open Days website ([www.heritageopendays.org.uk](http://www.heritageopendays.org.uk))

(b) grant the National Trust acting as the coordinator for Heritage Open Days non-exclusive rights to use the images to promote the competition the images were submitted to or for similar future competitions within a five year period of the winners of the competition being announced;

(c) agree that the uses referred to at Clauses 12(a) and 12(b) above may include publishing, displaying or otherwise reproducing the images (whether on the internet, in the National Trust Magazine, in exhibitions or otherwise) provided such use is for the purposes of promoting the competition or similar future competitions only; and

(d) agree that the National Trust acting as the coordinator for Heritage Open Days may contact them using the contact details they provide to discuss potential use of the images beyond promotion of the competition. Such discussion and negotiation will be independent from the competition and will not affect entrants' chances of winning.

(e) agree that the National Trust acting as the coordinator for Heritage Open Days can use the image(s) non-commercially on its social media and in press releases for the promotion of future Heritage Open Days events.

13. The National Trust acting as the coordinator for Heritage Open Days will endeavour to credit the photographer whenever his or her image is used and published by the National Trust and/or Heritage Open Days.

14. The judging will be determined by the most visually appealing interpretations of this year's festival and theme.

15. The winners and two runners-up will be notified by email by 31 October 2019. A list of the winners and runners-up will be on the Heritage Open Days website. If a winner cannot be contacted or is not available, the National Trust reserves the right to select the first runner-up from the remaining shortlisted entries as the winner.

16. The overall winner of the Heritage Open Days 2019 photography Competition will see their image used within the official Heritage Open Days impact report, as well as on the Heritage Open Days website. In addition, they will receive a £100 Cotswold Outdoor Voucher provided by Cotswold Outdoor. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place will receive £50 and £35 Cotswold Outdoor Vouchers respectively, also provided by Cotswold Outdoor. The prizes as described are available on the date of publication. All prizes are non-transferable and there are no cash alternatives.

17. The winners may be required to take part in publicity and their name and county may be published on the Heritage Open Days website and other National Trust publications, as well as wider media reporting on the competition.

18. Events may occur that render the competition itself or the awarding of the prizes impossible due to reasons beyond the control of the National Trust and accordingly the National Trust may at its

absolute discretion vary or amend the promotion and the entrant agrees that no liability shall attach to the promoter as a result thereof.

19. Your image(s) and name will be securely stored on a National Trust drive and only accessed by National Trust staff. Your name will be associated with your image(s) for the purposes of captioning and crediting. All other data will be deleted within 3 months of the competition winners being announced.

20. English law applies and the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts shall prevail.
